JOHN THE REVELATOR

Australia 1945 - Two young brothers were awarded to the state and placed in a hardened boys' home. Twenty years later, they formed an Outlaw Motorcycle Club in Far North Queensland, known as 'the Revelators'.

This is their story...

SYNOPSIS

In 1945, John and Elias Schwarz were relinquished to the state and placed in a rigorous boys' home, where they endured a challenging upbringing marked by adversity.

Fourteen years later, during the Vietnam War, the brothers forged an unbreakable bond with their fellow soldiers, creating a lifelong brotherhood. Upon returning to Australia as war veterans, they faced ostracism from society, prompting them to establish an outlaw existence in Far North Queensland.

There, John and Elias founded the motorcycle club known as the Revelators, rallying their wartime comrades to join their ranks. Their territory soon came under threat when a rival motorcycle club, the Mountain Brothers, encroached to expand their illegal drug operations. The Mountain Brothers orchestrated a scheme to frame the Revelators for local robberies they did not perpetrate, igniting a fierce gang war between the two groups.

A consignment of narcotics is deposited into the ocean and subsequently recovered by the Revelators. Their strategy involves transporting the hidden shipment via rail to the rainforest township of Kuranda. Unbeknownst to the Revelators, the selected train, 'Rail Motor 1819,' is transporting the Railway Company's payroll for its employees. The train is ambushed en route to Kuranda, resulting in the disappearance of both the drugs and the payroll.

The 1973 heist of 'Rail Motor 1819' remains an unsolved enigma, shrouded in mystery to this day.

This action-packed heist drama unfolds against the turbulent backdrop of 1970s motorcycle gangs and drug wars, offering a narrative with global resonance that taps into contemporary audiences' growing fascination with the ruthless, competitive biker subculture of that era. This is evidenced by the success of Sons of Anarchy, which spanned seven seasons, and its spin-off Mayans M.C., which ran for five seasons.

Additionally, the 2024 feature film The Bike Riders, a crime drama released in June and now streaming on Netflix, has garnered an award and three nominations, further highlighting the enduring appeal of this genre.



DANIAL DONAI

WRITER DIRECTOR PRODUCER

I am Danial Donái, a seasoned professional with over four decades of expertise as a writer, film director, second unit director, stunt coordinator, and film producer within the global

motion picture industry. My career boasts numerous successes in Hollywood, where I had the privilege of collaborating with some of the world's most prominent stars, including my esteemed colleague, Arnold Schwarzenegger.

Originally from Brisbane, Australia, my cinematic journey began in 1984 in Sydney, where I launched my career as an action actor on the set of Mad Max Beyond Thunderdome, starring Mel Gibson and Tina Turner.

After achieving four prosperous years in the Australian film sector, I made a transformative move to Los Angeles in 1988. There, I honed my skills as an action actor while simultaneously developing my writing talents, propelling my career forward both on-screen and behind the camera.

While working on Batman & Robin, director Joel Schumacher reviewed my initial feature screenplay, Indestructible—an action-driven narrative—and praised my efforts, encouraging me to transition from acting to focus on writing and directing my own projects.

My filmography includes notable titles such as Die Hard 2, Men in Black, Swordfish, Ultraviolet, Matrix Reloaded, Gone in Sixty Seconds, Eraser, Jingle All the Way, and Batman & Robin. Following my Hollywood achievements, I returned to Brisbane, seamlessly shifting to a full-time role in writing, directing, and producing.

To date, I have authored ten feature film screenplays, with three currently in active development. In 2007, I wrote, directed, and produced my debut 90-minute Australian feature, Like a Bat Outta Hell, distributed by TriCoast Worldwide, CA, USA.

In 2016, I crafted, directed, and produced my second 94-minute Australian feature, The Night Flyers. Toward the end of 2024, I wrote, directed, and produced the 30-minute short film Deep Red Water, which earned the Best Short Film accolade at the New York International Film Festival (NYIFF).

In early 2024, I completed the initial draft of John the Revelator, a true-story project that has been under development throughout the year and is slated for production in 2026.

DIRECTOR'S STATEMENT



As the screenwriter and director of 'John the Revelator', my creative vision draws inspiration from the 1974 Australian cinematic landmark, 'Stone' and the vibrant subculture of 'outlaw' bikers during the 1970s, along with their iconic motorcycles. Many of these bikers were returned Vietnam veterans who, despite their service, found themselves marginalized in the very nation they defended.



This narrative is as much a celebration of the distinctive atmosphere and ethos of that subculture as it is an exploration of what it meant to embody the identity of an Australian 'outlaw' biker during that era - an experience that feels almost foreign to us in 2024. Although I am not a veteran, I rode solo on motorcycles throughout the 1970s and 1980s and remain an enthusiastic rider to this day. This personal journey has given me an intimate understanding of the lifestyle and

the profound camaraderie that defined the biker community.



The narrative unfolds against breathtaking lush rainforests landscapes and of Far North Queensland, where the environment itself emerges as a compelling character, enriched by the extensive use of exterior settings. Even in today's smaller towns, the preserved streets and architecture from that bygone era lend an authentic cinematic texture and a palpable sense of realism to the film.

My vision is to infuse the movie with the genuine spirit and dynamic energy characteristic of that time, while seamlessly blending elements of humour and romance into its core action-drama framework. These scenes will highlight the intense realism that defines the storyline, drawing inspiration from the iconic The Wild One, by Marlon Brando and the aw, gritty authenticity of, Sons of Anarchy.

INVESTMENT OPPORTUNITY

- a) We cordially invite you to invest in John the Revelator, an exciting film project with a preliminary top-sheet budget of AUD \$5,999,999.00 (see page 6 for details on top-sheet vs full budget). A comprehensive full budget and detailed shooting schedule will be finalised once the majority of funding is secured, ensuring transparency and precision for our valued investors.
- b) Participants will gain a proportional interest in the film as tenants in common alongside other investors.
- c) Should the film fail to secure full funding, all contributed funds will be promptly returned to investors.
- d) Returns for investors will be generated from the film's distribution revenues across Australia and international markets.
- e) Investors will receive their respective share first, augmented by an additional 20%, of the Gross Receipts collected by the production company from the film's global distribution, until each investor's initial investment is fully recouped.
- f) Net Profits from the film's distribution will be evenly split 50/50 with the producers. Investors' entitlement to proceeds will conclude seven years following the film's initial distribution date.

- This top-sheet is for a mid-tier indie action-drama feature film (90-110 min runtime), emphasising Australian locations for rebates. Assumes local cast/crew to minimise costs, with rebates (Federal Location Offset 30% + Queensland PDV/state incentives up to 15% = 45% effective rebate on qualifying spend). Pre-rebate total ~\$6M AUD; post-rebate effective \$3.7M AUD.
- Relevance to 2025 Australian Market: The budget aligns with mid-tier Australian indie films (\$4.53-10.57M AUD pre-rebate for action-dramas). The pre-rebate total (\$6M AUD) is competitive, leveraging Queensland's combined incentives for a lower effective cost.

- (ii) their commissions, costs and expenses;

THIRD, to pay actors and writers union

residuals.

FOURTH, to repay any production cash flow lender.

FIFTH, to the Investor and any other investors on an equal proportionate basis until each Investor has recovered 120 % of its investment.
